Criteria for grading in-class performance

The following explains the grade distribution for the participation portion of your grade. Remember that I will monitor class participation daily and through active participation you can raise your grade from the assumed average (C) position.

9-10 The excellent language learner (A level):

- 1. Shows initiative.
- 2. Initiates and maintains interaction with fellow students and the instructor.
- 3. Shows leadership in group activities
- 4. Almost never uses English in discussions and group activities.
- 5. Asks questions mainly in French.

8-8.5 The good language learner (B level):

- 1. Shows willingness to participate.
- 2. Cooperates fully in discussions and group activities, although may not necessarily be a leader.
- 3. Answers readily when called upon.
- 4. Elaborates somewhat on answers.
- 5. Occasionally resorts to English.

7-7.5 The average language learner (C level):

- 1. Participates more passively than actively.
- 2. Tends to use English, especially in small group activities.
- 3. Gives slightly more than one-word answers.

6.5 The below-average learner (D level):

- 1. Participates grudgingly.
- 2. Speaks mostly English in discussions and small group activities.
- 3. Generally does not cooperate in small group activities
- 4. Seems distracted and does not fully pay attention in class (texts, falls asleep, etc.), yet does participate on a very basic level.

0-6 The failing language learner (F level):

- 1. Is always obviously unprepared for discussions.
- 2. Is disruptive, prevents other students from hearing, etc.
- 3. Refuses to participate in class activities.
- 4. Is disrespectful to other students and the instructor (i.e. talks when others are talking).
- 5. Has not mastered enough French to be able to participate actively in class activities.
